
#### **Section 1: Demographics of Survey Respondents**

As demonstrated in the below graph, there were 26 (i.e. 87%) urban based young people who responded to the survey and there were 4 (i.e.13%) rural based respondents.




#### 17 Parents/Carers responded to the survey

Age range of Parent/Carer respondents: 19 years to 77 years
















### Thematic Map of Young People's Responses to Q4



Theme	Representative Quote
Difficulties with restrictions	"They are supportive but difficult when you have to keep the 2km distance and cannot go places."  "Go in the car"
Missing family	"What I want is unrealistic. I want to be with my brother and sister."
Help with adapting to loosening restrictions	"As we start to open places back up and we're allowed to leave our homes little by little, I think what YAP can do is support me mentally and help me leave the house and adapt. Spending time outside and adapting to surroundings, having the support and reassurance is enough. In the meantime, using the funds to help others financially (like buying necessities for households) would be helpful."
In praise of YAP Advocates	"Young person feels her support is still ongoing, is finding YAP a good life line. Young person is happy and feels all her needs are being met."  "Being an outlet - great support."
Extension to their YAP programme	"Not much. Maybe extend some contracts so that we can do a bit more before we finish." "Get an extension on my case."
Increase the "weekly budget" guideline	"Up the budget from €15. It's not a realistic budget to stick to for a whole week."
Technical support	"To see if we get a laptop or tablet to help with learning

	stuff."  "If I could find a way to get TV stations on our telly or fix our remote."
Help with sports	"Help with getting sports equipment i.e. boxing gloves and punching bag."  "Go to a gym; go-karting; motorbiking."
